National Security News Bites

FIVE THINGS TO KNOW

- 1. Nine military officers who had worked decades ago at a nuclear missile base in Montana have been diagnosed with blood cancer and there are "indications" the disease may be linked to their service, according to military briefing slides obtained by The Associated Press. One of the officers has died.
- 2. A woman who stole nearly \$500,000 from the federal Veterans Affairs department by impersonating her dead mother for nearly 50 years has been spared a prison term. Irene Ferrin, 76, of Cincinnati, had pleaded guilty last August to theft of public money. She was sentenced to a year of home detention and five years of probation, and also must repay the \$461,780 that she improperly received.
- 3. U.S. Central Command forces captured two Islamic State militants during a partnered helicopter and ground assault raid in eastern Syria on Saturday, CENTCOM said in a news release. One civilian received minor injuries in the raid that led to the capture of Abdallah Hamid Muslih al-Maddad, AKA Abu Hamza al-Suri, an ISIS facilitator; and Husam Hamid al-Muslih al Maddad, al-Khayr, an ISIS facilitator and logistician.
- 4. Poland will ask Germany for permission to send some of the Polish army's Leopard tanks to Ukraine, Polish Prime Minister Mateusz Morawiecki said Monday, as he pushes Europe to send more military hardware to Kyiv amid complaints that Germany is being too slow in helping to thwart Russia's invasion.
- 5. Two Pentagon officials will visit two of the largest U.S. bases in Japan next week to address ongoing concerns over a lack of health care for Defense Department civilian employees and their families, according to spokesmen at both installations. Gilbert Cisneros Jr., undersecretary of defense for personnel and readiness, and Seileen Mullen, acting assistant secretary of defense for health affairs, will host town hall meetings at Yokota Air Base on Monday and at Yokosuka Naval Base the following day, Jan. 31.

FROM THE LANDING ZONE: Ukraine war reopens allied 'arsenals of democracy' By Alan W. Dowd

"Democracy's fight against world conquest is being greatly aided, and must be more greatly aided, by the rearmament of the United States and by sending every ounce and every ton of munitions and supplies that we can possibly spare to help the defenders who are in the frontlines," President Franklin Roosevelt intoned as tyrant regimes descended on democracies across Asia and Europe. Our enemies "must be out-fought and out-produced," he said, adding, "We must be the great arsenal of democracy."

Eight decades later, the valiant Ukrainian people are doing the fighting, while America and its allies are producing the weapons needed to defend the frontlines of freedom.

America's arsenal Defense Secretary Lloyd Austin cogently explains why America and its free-world allies have reopened their arsenals to support Ukraine. "Putin's war of choice is a direct threat to European security ... Russian

aggression is a clear challenge to our NATO allies ... Russia's deliberate cruelty is an attack on our shared values ... And finally, Russia's invasion tears at the rules-based international order that keeps us all secure ... Our support for Ukraine's self-defense is an investment in our own security and prosperity."

The United States has poured some \$20 billion in military assistance into Ukraine, with billions more pledged and in the pipeline.

Reloading "Freedom must be armed better than tyranny," President Volodymyr Zelensky of Ukraine has observed. That's true not only for frontline democracies like Ukraine, but also for the rest of the free world, which underscores the urgent challenge of replenishing the arsenals of democracy. NATO militaries, weapons manufacturers and supply chains – unaccustomed to the <u>burn rate</u> of high-intensity combat between two modern near-peer militaries – are scrambling to restock their inventories and maintain their own deterrent capabilities.

Indeed, Washington must ensure, first and foremost, that America's arsenal has the weapons needed to defend America's democracy and deter America's enemies – which brings us back to another line from FDR's "Arsenal of Democracy" address: "the rearmament of the United States."
